

BACK-UP PROCEDURES WHEN TRANSCOM IS NOT WORKING

These procedures are based upon the CAST Transportation Management Plan.

In the event that the TRANSCOM location system is not available, a telephone call-in system will be employed. The required reports are as follows:

A telephone call to the WIPP Central Monitoring Room (CMR) by the driver every two hours and when crossing state borders, or as soon thereafter as practical, to report the shipment location.

- The CMR will then call the TRANSCOM Control Center (TCC). If the tracking system is down but the software is functioning, TCC will move the icon manually. State TRANSCOM operators will still be able to monitor the shipments over TRANSCOM.
- CMR will notify each state thirty minutes prior to a shipment reaching its border. CMR will also notify each state once a shipment has left its borders. Attached is the list of contacts for each state.

Any delay in transit greater than two hours, and the reason for such delay, will be reported by the carrier to WIPP, which will in turn relay the information to the facility from where the shipment originated.
