DR. STEPHEN PRIOR

Dr. Prior is the founding President of Quantum Leap Health Sciences (QLHS), the latest venture formed by the Quantum Leap group of companies (Newark, DE). QLHS is focused on the use of innovative technologies to improve healthcare and healthcare delivery with an initial focus on the most challenging problems and issues impacting military personnel.

Steve was the former Executive Director of the National Security Health Policy Center at the Potomac Institute for Policy Studies and is also the founding Executive Director of the National Center for Critical Incident Analysis which is based at the National Defense University (Washington D.C.) where he also holds an appointment as a Distinguished Research Professor.

Dr. Prior has served as a Visiting Professor at the Royal Military College of Science (UK); Visiting Lecturer at DNBCC and the Royal Army Medical Corps (UK MoD); and a Visiting Lecturer with NATO (Panel 7-NBC; NATO-ARW). Previous to joining the Potomac Institute, he served as the President and CEO of DynPort, LLC. He has spent the last 20 years working in the commercial biotechnology sector and has proven skills in the identification and appraisal of technology, project management and business development including focused growth of biotechnology and pharmaceutical projects from initial research to licensed products.

Steve holds a BS (Honors) in Microbiology from the University of Kent (UK) and PhD in Microbial Physiology from the University of Warwick (UK).

REED V. TUCKSON, M.D., FACP

A graduate of Howard University, Georgetown University School of Medicine, and the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania's General Internal Medicine Residency and Fellowship Programs, Dr. Tuckson is currently Senior Vice President of Consumer Health and Medical Care Advancement at UnitedHealth Group where he is responsible for working with all of the Company's business units to improve the quality and efficiency of health services.

Formerly, Dr. Tuckson served as Senior Vice President, Professional Standards, for the American Medical Association (AMA). He is former President of the Charles R. Drew University of Medicine and Science in Los Angeles; has served as Senior Vice President for Programs of the March of Dimes Birth Defects Foundation; and is a former Commissioner of Public Health for the District of Columbia.

Dr. Tuckson is an active member of the Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences and served as the Chairperson of its Quality Chasm Summit Committee and a member on their Committee on the Consequences of the Uninsured. Currently, he serves

as Chair of the Secretary of Health and Human Services' Advisory Committee on Genetics, Health and Society. Dr. Tuckson has also held other federal appointments, including cabinet level advisory committees on health reform, infant mortality, children's health, violence, and radiation testing.

CHRISTOPHER A. VIEHBACHER

Chris Viehbacher has served as President, US Pharmaceuticals, GlaxoSmithKline since January 2003. Previously he had been President, Pharmaceuticals Europe, since 2001.

Chris joined the company when it was Wellcome GmbH, Germany in 1988 as Chief Financial Accountant and was promoted to Finance Director in 1989. From 1993 to 1995, he served as President and Chief Executive Officer of Burroughs Wellcome Inc., Canada. He joined Glaxo Wellcome France in 1995 as Vice President, Strategy and Integration, following a period based in London as a member of the coordination team during the Glaxo Wellcome integration. In 1996, he became General Manager of Glaxo Wellcome France and the following year was promoted to Chairman and Managing Director.

In January 1999, he took on the additional role of Director, Continental Europe (President Directeur General) of Glaxo Wellcome France. He was then named Regional Director, Europe for Glaxo Wellcome in 2000 and served as a member of the Glaxo Wellcome Executive Committee.

Before joining Glaxo Wellcome, Chris worked with Price Waterhouse in Germany and Canada. He graduated from Queen's University, Ontario, with a degree in Commerce and completed his training in Canada as a Chartered Accountant. Chris resides in Raleigh, North Carolina, with his wife Alison and their three children. He holds a dual German and Canadian citizenship.

Michael Samoszuk, M.D., is the Chief Medical Officer of Roche Diagnostics Corporation (Indianapolis Headquarters for North America), the number 1 diagnostics company in the world.
